Climate Change Governance

Through Climate Action in Africa, Canadian climate change experts contribute to building climate governance capacity of Sub-Saharan Africa countries to implement their Paris Agreement and related UNFCCC commitments. This includes supporting the implementation of the UNFCCC GAP, Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), development of Low Emissions Development Strategies (LEDS), access to climate finance and participation in global market-based mechanisms, such as Article 6 of the Paris Agreement.

Opportunities to reinforce climate action in Sub-Saharan Africa countries range from processes and mechanisms to update NDCs and coordinating multisectoral stakeholders to implement NDCs, to improving countries' influence at UNFCCC negotiations and improving monitoring of progress of NDC implementation. Other opportunities include tracking financial flows and support received; establishing appropriate institutional, regulatory and legal frameworks; improving access to carbon mechanisms; and support for modelling and consultations between civil society and government in renewable energy, forestry, water resources and agriculture.

To help Sub-Saharan Africa countries achieve their climate objectives, capable institutions and support are key to overcoming barriers to climate investments and improving financial resources, technology development, institutional arrangements, legal and regulatory, involvement in the UNFCCC and Paris Agreement process, and availability of climate data to inform decision-making.
